Callico tube of cloth w<sup>th</sup> everything able to it three Cuntry Cloath Gounds and Cotts (?) 1 Doz<sup>n</sup> shifts 1 Sillk Boddis w<sup>th</sup> all the rest of my apparel; & as for all my cattell my will is that thay be sould to the best advantage & the money arrising from them to pay my lawfull Debts & Funarale charges & the surplusage I give to my aforosd (aforesaid?) loving son Will Colltson w<sup>th</sup> horse and all the remainder of Estate or what ? to ever & Do appoint my trusty and loving Frinds Mr John Gray & Mr Thomas Whitmell as lawfull Executors Revolking all former Wills by me made Rattifieing & Confirming this & no other my Last will & Testiament I wittness whereof I have hereunto Sett my hand & Seale this Twenteth Day of July One Thousand Seven Hunard Thirty two
