

TRANSCRIPTION OF THE WILL OF SANDER(S) COALSON .

I Sander Coalson of the County of Trigg and State of Kentucky do hereby make my last Will and testament in manner and form following that is to say: after my just debts and funneral (sic) expenses is paid. I will and give to my beloved wife Bashabay (Bathsheba) Coalson the tract of land, I now live on fifty acres and all my perishable property consisting of one horse one mare & colt six head hogs household and kitchen furniture and after her death: I will to my son Shedreck Coalson the above named fifty acres of land and the remainder of the above property as I have given my other children their portion of my Estate in advance as Witness my hand and Seal this 18th day of October 1849.

Apparently, it was not possible to photograph this will, and there is no way of telling whether there is a handwritten will filed in Trigg County, or not, as in the cases of Mary Coltson and her son John Collson, the latter two being filed in Anson County, North Carolina.
