Robert Alexander and Joseph Jonathan were both graduates of the University of Mississippi, were school teachers, and taught, at one time in a Methodist College in Granbury, Texas. Mary Eleanor married John Marshall Coalson and lived her life out at Bethesda. Elizabeth Matilda married Charles Potts, from England; they moved to Ranger, Texas, where Mr. Potts had a drug store. Martha Capers married John G. Leach; this couple lived at Bethesda at one point in their lives and were donors of two acres of land for the current cemetery. Adelaide Celestia married Robert Guild West, and she lived many years in Weatherford, Texas. Alice Ann Black married Thomas Blackburn in 1870; later, she married George Boon; she died in Fort Worth, Texas, but is buried at Bethesda as is her sister, Mary Eleanor. Augusta Letitia married Rev. William Jones Moore, Methodist, who was instrumental in helping locate the Methodist College at Granbury, Texas.

Mrs. Shirley, for the most part, made her home with her daughter. She was old, almost blind and almost deaf when she died in her daughter's home in February, 1900, but she was still very faithful to attend all the church services; she said it was her duty to set a good example for those coming after her. She is buried at Bethesda, the first of some seven or eight generations of descendants buried there.
